WHY?

International Labour The Organisation (ILO) and The European Centre for the Development of Vocational Training (Cedefop) have launched a global research project to investigate skills needed for a green economy where they call for more and better skilled workers (find the European Synthesis Report here). Lifelong learning is one of the key aspects of VET in a changing society. The current VET system, including policies and practitioners, has hence to be adapted to conveying green skills.

WHAT IS Green Skills

"Adapting Green Skills to Vocational Education" is an EU supported project that aims to include green skills into the vocational education and training (VET) systems of five respective partcountries. The ner two-year project is part of the Leonardo da Vinci Lifelong Learning Programme and started in October 2013



RESULTS

Key outcomes of the Green Skills Project are two reports and a recommendation paper. One report investigates the situation of green skills and green jobs with the aim to understand and identify a potential for the development inclusion and of skills. green The policy report informs about environmental policies in the partner countries with their respective opportunities to call for and enable the promotion of green skills.
